Registration Procedure and Deadlines:

Registration will be through the student portal URSA. To register, you will need to have a UNC student account. If you've previously attended UNC, in any capacity, you will have an existing student account. If you have never attended UNC, you'll need to create a student account. The process of creating or reactivating an account takes approximately 72 hours, you must have completed this process to enroll, and you must be enrolled on or before the course add deadline. This course will allow you to consider themes of place through artmaking, discussion and reflection . We will discuss what home means to us, how we create places for ourselves and how the places we inhabit create us. We will also examine displacement, loss and living "in between" significant places in our lives. We will apply the practices of examining contemporary art and making art ourselves to how we provide spaces and places of learning and growth to students.

Course Description:

ART 513 is provided by the University of Northern Colorado to "Update skills and knowledge of professionals in the discipline. Goals and objectives will be specifically directed at individual professional enhancement rather than the acquisition of general discipline knowledge or methodologies. S/U or letter

graded. Repeatable, under different subtitles."

This course will allow participants to explore the themes presented at the 2025 Institute for Creative Teaching through further reading, artmaking, conversation, and reflection.

Course Requirements:

1. Attend all three days of 2025 Institute for Creative Teaching

Pay special attention to keynotes and to workshops that challenge you to think about how place and home are part of artmaking and creative teaching. How do we cultivate a place for ourselves and our students? How is a space transformed by the stories told about it? How do I map a place? Eventually, are we all foreigners and strangers? Utilize the ART 513 CANVAS course for supplemental materials and required discussions. There will be information about speakers and workshops, readings for further research and discussion boards with questions for collaborative learning

- 2. June 9 (if registered)
 - a) Log in to the UNC Canvas Platform
 - b) Browse through the information about the 2025 Institute
 - c) Familiarize yourself with background information about speakers and activities
- 3. June 10-12
 - d) Use the Discussion Board on Canvas to post key "take aways" from the conference sessions you attend
 - e) Begin own visual or verbal story about Place. This might address your own living spaces, the environment, or how you honor the places of others throughout the world. Your personal story can be written or shown as an artists book. You might include responses to other artists who are exploring place.
- 5.) June 14-21
 - f) Post your written story or images of your artists' book
 - g) Post a short discussion about at least one artist who works with themes of place. Respond to two others post
